Guests of The Red Horse Inn will enjoy the summer by visiting a historical bridge, then, travel up a mountain road past magnificent forests that envelope crystal lake waters. Next, guests will stroll the quaint Historical streets of a charming Victorian mountain village. Visit the shops and Antique stores. Afterwards, spend 3 afternoon hours kayaking down the cool waters of the Green River. For those that want to have the thrill of a lifetime, experience

The Gorge Zipline Canopy Tour.

End the day by hiking in a botanical sanctuary to a 90 foot waterfall.

### Poinsett Bridge

By far one of the most magical bridges, Poinsett Bridge will awe and inspire. It is the oldest bridge in South Carolina and is one of three bridges on a road that originally ran from Charleston, SC, to Asheville, NC. The bridge is part of the 120 acres of the Poinsett Bridge Heritage Preserve. It was named after Joel R. Poinsett, a former US Congressman, and it has a notable gothic feel.

Imagine for a moment...

listen closely for the ghosts of soldiers, horses and wagons traveling by.

Enjoy hiking and exploring the trails surrounding the bridge.

*From the Inn: Turn right onto Campbell Rd, turn right onto Tugaloo Rd. Turn Left onto 11 and follow 6.5 miles to Old Highway 11. Turn right. go 1.6 miles to Callahan Mountain Rd. Turn right Go 1.3 miles and watch carefully on your left for the parking area. A railing and some steps are on the right leading to the bridge.*



## The Watershed

After your visit to The Poinsett Bridge, your journey will take you up the mountain past the Greenville Reservoir. This beautiful, rural drive leads you through a dense canopy of old growth trees.

Through the lush growth of trees and shrubbery you will be able to glimpse the North Saluda Reservoir. This is a man made lake encompassing 17,000 acres and is entirely owned and operated by the Greenville Water System. There are no recreational activities allowed on the lake so that residents can enjoy the drinking water it provides, however, this allows visitors to enjoy the natural unspoiled beauty of the lake and the old growth forest.

It is visually stunning.

*Continue on Callahan Mountain Rd for 3.4 miles. Take a sharp right at Old Highway 25. Go 3.9 miles to Saluda Rd. Go 2 miles and continue on State Highway S-23-17. Travel 2.4 miles to Mountain Page Rd where you'll continue for 1.1 miles. Turn right at Old Mountain Page Rd. Go 1.3 miles then take a slight right at Mountain Page Rd. .3 miles. Mountain Page Rd turns slightly left and becomes Greenville St.*

*Greenville Street deadends on Main Street (Highway 176). Take a right and Green River Adventures will be on your right in a few hundred yards.*

## Saluda

Welcome to the charming town of Saluda, what once was a crossroads for traders and herders. In the late 1870's a railroad was constructed to bring tourists seeking the fresh, cool mountain air. The town bustled with travelers and Victorian Inns. Celebrities of the era visited and drew more attention to the tiny town. Now, enjoy it's eclectic shops and Green River Adventures for your Whitewater Adventure.

## Green River Adventures

Green River Adventures offers inflatable kayaking trips on the cool, mountainous waters of the Green River. The Lower Green River Adventure is a 6-mile stretch on the lower section of the river that offers easy to navigate rapids and big swimming holes. The Lower Green is great for all types of paddlers. This trip is perfect for a safe river adventure. The river is beautiful and offers several spots to stop along the way for a swim in the deep green swimming holes. These trips are usually 3 hours long.

You'll want to leave the inn early enough to arrive at Green River Adventures by the 12:00, 1:00 or 2:00 or 3:00 departure times. They also offer early morning White Water Adventures.

*From Green River Adventures to The Gorge Zipline Canopy Tour, turn right on 176 and follow to Ozone Dr. Turn left and continue over the Interstate. Continue straight on Holbert Cove Rd ¼ mile to Honey Bee Drive on the left.*

Begin your 3½ hour trip perched on the rim of the famous Green River Gorge and plunge into untouched wilderness featuring 11 zip lines, 2 huge rappels and a sky bridge. THE GORGE offers unique perspectives and dramatic effects. Comprised solely of tree-based platforms, The Gorge drops an unprecedented 1,100 vertical feet from start to finish. Experience breathtaking views of 10,000 acres of protected forest and hear the roar of the Green River.

*From The Gorge, take a right onto Ozone Drive and then a left onto 176. Follow down the mountain approximately 2 ½ miles, looking on your right for the signs to Pearson's Falls.*



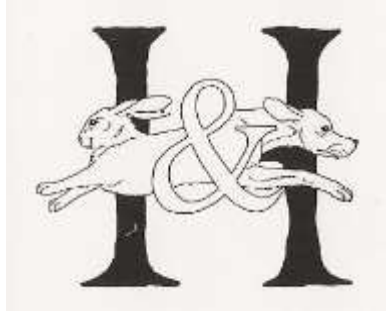
## Pearson's Falls

Pearson's Falls is one of the most beautiful falls in the area. As you stroll along the tranquil, easy path to the falls, notice the wonderful job the Tryon Garden Club has done at maintaining the beauty of the trails and the falls. This is a nonprofit group and the small entrance fee is well worth both the hike and the view of the waterfalls. How else could you feel more relaxed and away from the everyday rush of daily life?  
Allow yourself to unwind in this natural paradise.

Pearson's Falls Glen was originally purchased by Captain Charles William Pearson, who discovered this magical place. He and his heirs owned the land until 1931 when Pearson's son was forced to sell a portion of his holdings. The Tryon Garden Club purchased several hundred acres to create this botanical preserve.

The trail is open all year with varying opening and closing times. Average closing time is 5PM.

*To return to the Inn, take a right onto 176 and follow into Tryon all the way to the traffic light in Landrum. Take a right onto Highway 14. Go 5 miles to the blinking traffic light at 11. Take a right on 11. Go 1 mile. Take a left onto Tugaloo, go 1 mile. Take a left onto North Campbell, go 1 mile.
